


# ancestry library edition

## Getting started

1. Ancestry Library Edition delivers billions of records in census data, vital records, directories, and photos from countries all over the world. Collections are being added and updated all the time.

## Access

2. Ancestry Library Edition is usually available for use in your library only. Remote access to this platform has been temporarily enabled for library members due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
3. Click on the shortcut on [Aurora Montage](#) and enter your Aurora barcode and PIN.
