

DIGITAL STORYTELLING

Digital Storytelling is a program designed to teach the art of storytelling, digital illustration, and eBook creation.

Participants will learn the basics of storytelling structure and explore photography and digital drawing. They'll then move on to creating eBook layouts and designs, focusing on integrating text and imagery effectively.

Finally, they'll learn how to publish their eBooks online. By the end of the program, participants will have the skills to craft engaging stories, create accompanying visuals, and share their work with a wider audience.

WHO'S YOUR MOB? FIRST NATIONS FAMILY HISTORY

State Library of Queensland's Who's Your Mob? resources will connect Aboriginal and Torres Strait peoples with family history information.

Who's Your Mob? First Nations Family History is a unique set of seven videos and nine information guides that step you through the process of doing First Nations family history research.

The videos and guides include information on Getting Started, Births, Deaths and Marriages records, Newspapers, Photographs and Station, Mission, Police and Church Records.

All of the videos and guides have a focus on using State Library's collections and, where necessary, the collections of other record-keeping institutions in Queensland and across Australia.

Participants work through the process of uncovering their family history, exploring diverse resources, and utilising digital skills to document and understand your family background comprehensively

Births, Deaths and Marriages

Use birth, death, and marriage records efficiently, understand record types, access state registries, and explore alternative resources to enhance their family history research digitally

Station, Mission, Police and Church Records

Access various records at the State Library of Queensland, including pastoral station, government reserves, and mission records, as well as police and church records, while also receiving guidance on adoption services and access to oral histories, to enhance their digital skills for family history research

Newspapers

Use newspapers to uncover family history details, accessing birth, marriage, death notices, social events, and legal records through resources like the State Library of Queensland and Trove, while also exploring online newspapers for comprehensive research, being mindful of historical biases

Photographs

Explore the diverse photograph collections at the State Library of Queensland, potentially uncovering images of their ancestors, including First Nations people and soldiers, offering insights into their family history

The Tindale Collection

Access the Tindale Collection at the State Library of Queensland, containing genealogical records and photographs of First Nations communities, enabling them to search for their family history via an online catalogue and learn how to fill out an enquiry form to obtain relevant information

The Margaret Lawrie Collection

View the Margaret Lawrie collection, containing genealogies and photographs related to Torres Strait Islander heritage, through an online catalogue search, enabling them to discover their family history and request relevant materials

Learn to correctly digitise physical content like documents and photographs for safe online storage in the proper file formats. Gain insights into comprehensive knowledge management solutions beyond just repositories for media files. These solutions interconnect cultural knowledge and real-world subject matter, providing perspectives into historical and present-day community life.



Such solutions categorise media into groups like Photos, Documents, Movies, Sounds, and Objects. Cultural knowledge is organised into categories such as People, Places, Collections, Flora/Fauna, Events, Activities, Spirituality, Stories, Organisations, and Technology. Records across categories are linked, forming a web of interrelated knowledge. The ability to expand and create new groups makes these flexible platforms for preserving diverse cultural aspects.

The process enables safeguarding of physical content while leveraging solutions that capture and interconnect cultural knowledge and real-world information, offering holistic perspectives on community life across time periods.






